Safe Church team - <u>Alan Mitchell</u> and <u>Marian Ashford</u> - spoke of screening of volunteers and Creating Safe Space training.

<u>Kids' Church</u> - Marian explained the ministry and invited volunteers to assist. She emphasised the importance of children to make connections with each other and to build relationships across the church community.

<u>Op Shop</u> - <u>Brenda White</u> spoke of the work of the Op Shop and the vision for opening on a Saturday morning to attract a different part group of shoppers. She explained that the opening hours of the shop depends upon the availability of volunteers and that a minimum of 2 are required for the shop to remain open. She invited us to work in the Op Shop.

CAP Money - <u>Robert Ardill</u> and Kerrie Whitton covered the changes to the CAP delivery model so that coaches have now been trained as Money Mentors, their continuing commitment to the deliver of the CAP Money Course, and the possibilities for the congregation to engage with CAP mentees or to join the team of mentors.

<u>Connect through Craft</u> - <u>Frances Bate</u> outlined the RESPECT philosophy of this group that is for crafters inside and outside the church family and invited others to attend and enjoy a cup of tea as well as crafters.

Future Directions Group 25 - Alf Jonas is facilitating this group and presented the work of the group as adjustments to the course to bring us to our destination.

<u>Community of Givers</u> - Ian Reid outlined the process for distribution of vouchers to sole parent families in our neighbourhood.

<u>Eldership team</u> - Ian Reid presented the four key responsibilities of Elders specified in our <u>Constitution</u> and presented some of the immediate goals. He mentioned that, over the last couple of years, the Elders had been able to focus on these because of the work of the Operations team. Ian introduced Rob and Mike.

Operations team - <u>Daphne Bate</u> presented the biblical foundations for tandem functions for governance of places of worship and aspects of the church's infrastructure including the functional structure chart, the process for a new ministry, activity or event and the recruitment of volunteers and matching them with ministry teams.

## About our people - Levels of engagement

**Attendances** for 2024 - the average weekly attendance for 2024 was 70. The lowest was 51 and the highest 113 (Easter with Baptisms) and Christmas with 95 as the next highest.

Database - we have 74 email addresses on our Mailing List.

Members - There were 50 members at the time of our AGM in December 2024.



Church App (on Church Central) There are 82 active accounts,

**Prayer Team** - 31 members are sent notifications, via the App, when a request for prayer is received.

Baptisms - 11 were baptised in 2024.

Post Jenke Cct attendees - There are 50 regular attenders who have never worshipped at the building at Jenke Cct.

## Geographical Location - where we live

People who attend our church are spread throughout the Lanyon, Tuggeranong and Woden valleys with some travelling from Casey, Googong and Cooma. We also have an on-line community who regularly view our sermons and/ or listen to our music in Australia-wide and overseas locations.

## Location of the Harvest field - where we are called to work

The mindset of neighbours and serving our neighbourhood in a geographical sense does not serve our purposes. However, a few locals have transferred to the Garratt Street Centre since we the church's activities moved into their neighbourhood and actually walk to church.

Our neighbours do not live, work and play in Wanniassa, that's just the address of our property. However, we do have a responsibility to maintain respectful relationships in the Wanniassa neighbourhood, for example, maintaining the public footpaths, thoughtful use of the car park, controlling noise levels of our activities and, perhaps most importantly modelling friendly relationships with the businesses in the shopping centre where our custom at the shops is appreciated.

Our harvest field is wherever we are on the six days when we are not gathered at The Garratt Street Centre. Each of us has an essential role in the outreach of the church as a worker in these varied harvest fields.



## About People - our giving

An analysis of on-line Offerings for December 2024 (which represents a standard month) shows that 49 givers transfer 35 monthly offerings. Couples attending the church who give through a joint account are counted as 2 givers for the purpose of this analysis.

## Op Shop News

A number of people have expressed their desire to work in the Op Shop on Saturdays. This enables us to go forward with the vision of the Manger and others, that the shop open on Saturdays to meet a current trend in our community when people visit a number of Op Shops as a weekend recreation.

The Manager presented an Induction/Training session on Saturday 22 March. The presentation covered all aspects of working in the shop and was followed by a tour of the workshop. Volunteers are now completing their Creating Safe Space requirements and Applications and interviews are being arranged and a roster drawn up. There are some unfilled time slots if you wish to join the team.

The seasonal change of stock is well under way and the shop is looking fresh and we continue to receive feedback on the welcoming and well appointed shop is. And people love the prices! As the shop does not have overheads for rent and utilities (which are met by the church), we are able to offer much lower prices than the bigger charities.

By popular request from attendees at the Open Baptists Gathering, the shop was opened and record sales were



achieved in 1 hour. Within in a couple of hours of having the gate and shop open on the first Saturday of trading (22 March) with good sales especially considering that advertising of the opening was only hours before.

Wanniassa High school has once again added the Op Shop to their list of work experience opportunities for students. Typically a student will complete a half-day shift at the shop once each week for a term. Brenda is well-known at the school and volunteers her time their to teach students to crochet.
